



# Future of Europe After Juncker's Commission

"It should not be a lost cause: forum on institutional reforms with innovative ideas"

In September 2016, just months after the citizens of the United Kingdom decided to leave the European Union, the European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker delivered his State of the Union Address. He stressed that despite the UK leaving us, we shall walk "towards a better Europe - a Europe that protects, empowers and defends".

In March 2017, his Commission presented the White Paper on the Future of Europe, presenting the five distinct scenarios for the future development of the EU until 2025. These were meant to "help steer a debate on the future of Europe (…) offer a series of glimpses into the potential state of the Union by 2025 depending on the choices we will jointly make. (…) the five scenarios are illustrative in nature to provoke thinking." And indeed they did provoke the debate.

On September 12, 2018 President Juncker will again and for the last time deliver his annual State of the Union Address. Now that we are in the last year of this Commission's term, let's ask:

Where did this debate take us? In which direction has the Commission steered the Union since 2016? What are the main takes from the last SOTEU Address? What can next European Election and new Commission bring into the future of Europe debate?
