THE GOLDEN RULE OF SUSTAINING COMPETITIVENESS IN THE GLOBAL ARENA (THEME: SUSTAINING COMPETITIVENESS IN THE EXPORT MARKETS THROUGH INNOVATION, PRODUCTIVITY, AND GROWTH)

Protectionist sentiment has been on the rise around the world. Citizens who feel left behind by globalization challenge the free trade agenda in world's leading trading nations. On the other hand, we are living at the age of global value chains. The cross-border flows of goods, investment, services, knowhow and people create a complex system of interdependency through the production processes that are fragmented across countries. The disruption of the value chains can have not only major economic implications but also indirect political and security implications. It is time to frame the debate beyond "protectionism versus free trade" and to discuss the crucial elements of a progressive, socially and environmentally sensitive trade agenda. How can we promote stronger growth, more and better jobs, higher living standards for all via trade policy? # 12:00-12:45 BUILDING RESILIENT BUSINESSES IN TURKEY

Disasters expose people and businesses to damaging consequences. In the last ten years, disasters affected 1.7 billion people and caused total damage of US\$1.4 trillion. While the government maintains the overall responsibility for responding to emergencies, local communities and private sector networks also play crucial roles in disaster risk reduction, emergency preparedness, response and recovery. Private sector networks can be major contributors increasing the scale and effectiveness of the response in a coordinated manner together with national actors.

The World Humanitarian Summit in 2016 in Istanbul highlighted the need for deeper cooperation in disaster risk management. The private sector, the United Nations and partners launched the Connecting Business initiative (CBİ) which engages the private sector strategically before, during and after emergencies.

Turkey is a disaster-prone country. For example, 70% of the population lives in an area highly vulnerable to earthquakes. In addition, the country faces risks of forest fires, landslides, floods and conflict. In this event, a private sector network will be launched to engage the private sector more strategically and holistically to work with national actors.

The network will build from the Business Disaster Resiliency Program for Turkey (Saglam KOBI) enhancing the resilience of small- and medium-sized enterprises in Turkey and other business networks.

The lessons of the last decade's economic crisis demonstrates the need for a stronger Euro zone governance. The exponential velocity of the Fourth Industrial Revolution is challenging the viability of the European social model and global competitiveness. Democracies across Europe are being tested by rising populism. The Belt and Road Initiative initiated by China sets a new and ambitious vision for cross-regional collaboration for development through connectivity. With the potential involvement of more than 60 countries and regions and ongoing bilateral trade and investment disputes between China and major world economies, the success of the modern Silk Road will depend on more than funding pledges. A vigorous diplomacy, strong adherence to the principles of good governance, transparency and reciprocity as well as commitment to the environmental sustainability will be required.
